**FOR STUDENTS ENTERING FOURTH GRADE**

As an integral part of Selwyn's departmentalized program in the lower school, we strive to ensure that all of our students are actively reading, writing, and thinking during the summer break. All students are required to complete the following activities. Assignments should be completed over the summer and brought to class on the first day of school in August.

**LANGUAGE ARTS REQUIREMENT**

All students must read *Tuck Everlasting* by Natalie Babbitt. Using the attached book report form, write a book report on this book. All sections of the book report must be answered in **complete sentences** and in **cursive handwriting**. This book report should be turned in on the first day of class. We will work with this book throughout the first several weeks of school.

**MATH REQUIREMENT**

One of the most important reasons for assigning school work over the summer is for you to keep up with all you've learned this year and practice those skills which you will need when you return to school in August. To practice these skills, students will work toward reaching a target goal for progress based on their individual IXL Diagnostic scores.
