Included in Annual Tuition: Instruction and classroom costs, textbooks, athletics and in-school club fees, class books and materials except computers.

Additional charges may apply for extracurricular activities, travel, or other Selwyn related events.

To offer families a hedge against future inflation, the Board of Trustees is allowing families with rising 7th and 9th grade students to lock in this tuition rate for two years, and rising 10th grade students to lock in tuition for either two or three years. In order to qualify for the locked-in tuition rate, tuition for both years is due in full at the 2024 Option 1 payment deadline.

Discounts

Sibling Discount	Discount for two or more students attending Selwyn, applied to all but the highest tuition.	5% off net tuition for all but the highest tuition.
First Responder Discount	Tuition discount for children of fire fighters, police, emergency medical technicians, active military.	5% off net tuition
Option 1 Discount	Discount for cash or check payments of full tuition and fees if received on or before May 1, 2024 .	3% off net tuition



Required Fees

Application Fee	For new students only, one-time application fee of \$375 for domestic and \$1200 for international, non-refundable.
New Family Fee	One-time fee for enrollment processing and related activities for families whose children were not previously enrolled at Selwyn. Fees are \$1000 for one child, \$1500 for two or more children.
Re-enrollment/ Enrollment Deposit	\$500.00 non-refundable deposit (credited toward tuition and fees if paid within the two-week enrollment window)
Perspectives	Classes from first grade through twelfth grade take a required enrichment trip each year which constitute an additional cost.
Technology Fee	(K-12 Only): Each K-12 student is assigned either a laptop or tablet computer to help incorporate efficient technologies into the curriculum. The annual Lower School fee is \$295, Middle and Upper School fee is \$595. Signed usage agreement is required. No personal computers can be substituted.
Annual Fund	Like most independent schools, tuition only covers a portion of the cost of your children's education. Selwyn relies on the generosity of our community for their donations, gifts that support and enhance our curriculum, technology, programs and facilities. Selwyn's annual fund is a major component of this effort, and we appreciate the support of our families and friends during this campaign.

Optional Fees

Extended Care	We offer extended morning and afternoon care at an annual rate. Before care is free, and aftercare will be charged the following: \$2,450 for part time (3 or fewer days per week) and \$3,500 for full time. Before and Aftercare are included in tuition and fees for Pre-K and Kindergarten. A late fee of \$30 will be assessed after 6:00 p.m. and \$20 per each fifteen-minute increment thereafter.
Homework Club	Optional, teacher-supervised session each school day to enable students to complete assigned classwork on campus.
Transportation	Transportation to and from the North Denton area to our campus will be provided. Seating is limited, and cost will be \$90/month for part time or \$130/month for full time. Transportation not available to pre-school students.
Tuition Protection	The tuition protection option is available and allows for a partial return of tuition in the event of a withdrawal or dismissal. Tuition protection is available only at initial registration or reenrollment and is required of all Option 3 payment plans. The cost is ten percent (10%) of the total tuition. Refunds are calculated at a rate of 60% of the tuition for any week not begun. Terms are detailed in the enrollment contract.
International Student Support Fee	If needed, we can provide supplemental English support, tutoring, and/or a dedicated international student representative. The cost of required services is \$2200.



Payment Options and Policies

- Option 1** Tuition paid in full by **June 30, 2024**
This plan has a 3% discount if paid **on or before May 1, 2024**
- Option 2** 60% of total tuition paid on or before **June 30, 2024**
40% of total tuition, that is, the remaining tuition, paid on or before **January 6, 2025**
This plan incurs a 4% deferred payment fee.
- Option 3** This option offers deferred payments of up to 10 months, with equal monthly installments. Payments must start no later than July, 2024. All participants **MUST** be enrolled in FACTS for monthly drafts, no exceptions. FACTS charges a small processing fee that is payable upon enrollment (fee subject to change). Monthly payments will be drafted prior to the first month of enrollment and must be completed by April, 2025. *All participating students will be charged a Deferred Payment Fee of 10% of total tuition and fees, which includes tuition protection.*
- For all charges, a 4% financing charge applies to all payments made with a debit or credit card.
 - All tuition and fee payments are non-refundable per the terms noted in your enrollment contract.
 - All associated school charges (general, related) must be kept current and paid in full within 30 days of incurrence. Failure to keep accounts current can jeopardize the enrollment status of your student(s).
 - FACTS (formerly RenWeb) or other payment systems may add convenience fees or related charges, which are the responsibility of the family and will be added to accounts.
 - Late payments are subject to a finance charge of 1% per month, 12% per year, with a minimum charge of \$5.00. Other than tuition payments whose schedule is noted here, payments are due within 30 days of incurrence.
